

2023 SA Magic Convention Safe-Space Policy

The Cape Magicians Circle is committed to running a convention that will be enjoyed by all participants and attendees. Buying, or being gifted, a ticket to the event is open to everyone in good standing with the community, and attendees are expected to include veterans, professionals, novices, and hobbyists, as well as young magicians attending their first convention.

Making sure that the convention is a positive experience for everyone means ensuring a safe space free of harassment, regardless of a person's gender, race, age, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, personal appearance, or religion.

The Cape Magicians Circle, in collaboration with the College Of Magic, which is running the championships, which forms part of the convention, will not tolerate any form of harassment; sexual or bigotted language; offensive imagery; violence or intimidation; unwanted physical contact, which includes hugs and casual touching; or unwanted sexual attention, which includes comments and jokes.

Convention organisers will be monitoring the event to ensure that attendee behaviour remains positive and safe for all. If an attendee engages in harassing behaviour they will be warned to stop and the organisers may take extra action, including ejecting the person from the event.
